Digital assessment centre case study

Client: University of Lincoln Scale: 200 students





Date: April 2020



The aim

To increase the employability skills, confidence and knowledge of University of Lincoln students by simulating a graduate digital assessment centre.

The objectives

- Students can instantly apply their learning and feedback from professional and university assessors at an employer's assessment centre.
- Increase the number of graduate roles secured by students.
- Boost student confidence in applying for placements and graduate roles.

SRS collaborated with the University of Lincoln to deliver a digital assessment centre for 200 Business, Accounting & Finance and Economics students.

Project management

We managed the event on behalf of the University of Lincoln, provided a timeline of key milestones and set up a support line to assist students leading up to the event ensuring it ran smoothly on the day. A student welcome pack was produced which included a pre-event briefing video, mock job description, presentation brief, assessment platform login details and technical support guide. We arranged the logistics, sourced professional assessors to work alongside the university assessors and provided the online platform which students accessed to complete the event.

Materials

We designed all the exercises and supporting materials which were positioned as though they belonged to an employer replicating the 'live' environment.

Student journey

In the lead up to the event, we sent a series of 'keep warm' emails to students. Emails included logistical information and tips on how to complete each of the three exercises successfully, ensuring they were prepared and confident for the assessment centre.

On the day

Students logged in to the online assessment platform where they were greeted with a welcome video and presented with their schedule for the day. 21 SRS and university assessors were present to observe and score the students.

The exercises

E-Tray exercise: Students were presented with a time-sensitive e-tray exercise, where they reviewed information and discussed their conclusions with the assessor. Skills tested included adaptability, prioritisation, influencing and problem-solving.

Presentation: Students remotely delivered their presentations, testing their skills at presenting and reasoning.

Interview: Students completed their 1:1 mock interview based on the job description they were provided with.

After the event

Students received personalised and detailed feedback on their performance for each exercise highlighting their strengths and development areas. Copies of reports were given to the University to support further career planning if required.
